Influenza (flu) is a respiratory illness that is caused by an influenza virus. Influenza may cause mild to severe illness in some children. The best way to prevent your child and family from these viruses is to receive the annual flu vaccination.

Is It the Flu or a Cold?

Signs & Symptoms	<u>Flu</u>	<u>Cold</u>
Onset:	Sudden	Gradual
Fever:	Common, lasting 3-4 days	Rare
Cough:	Dry, can become severe	Hacking, mild
Muscle / Joint Aches / Pain:	Usual, some severe	Slight
Fatigue and Weakness:	Can last up to 2 weeks	Mild
Extreme Exhaustion:	Early and prominent	Never
Chest Discomfort:	Common	Mild/Moderate
Congestion:	Sometimes	Common
Sneezing:	Sometimes	Usually
Sore Throat:	Sometimes	Common
Vomiting and Diarrhea:	Rare	Never

- The incubation period for the influenza virus may be from 1-7 days
- Droplets from an infected individual spread the Influenza virus by a cough, sneeze or mucus
- These viruses can last on surfaces for hours and still infect others.
- It is important to wash hands consistently throughout the season to reduce your chances for infection
- Contagiousness for the influenza virus starts one day prior to the onset of symptoms until the resolution
- The influenza virus typically lasts 7-14 days
